us, when to eat, what to eat, what to wear, what time to go to bed, etc. Parents make these choices based on what they believe is in the best interest of the child. Safety, well being and learning or growth experience. Right reason. It is nice not to have the responsibility for some choices. As we get older our parents let go of those decision and allow us to experiment with those choices. We learn that there is reward or consequence for what we choose. It is nice to have that freedom to choose. Our growth is based on a mix of having the chance to make choices that we can and not having to make a decision that we are unqualified to make.

The choices that we make are based on many factors. Past experiences that have resulted in success or failure. What are the risks involved in one choice over another. We are fortunate that Frank Cheley decided to build a place just for young people to grow and build character and resiliency. Did he really know how important it would be to act spontaneously in the right? His focus has held up over the years.

Carole and I recently had a chance to visit and see first hand a new camp that is an extension of Frank's dream. The camp is called the Painted Turtle. It is located near Valencia, California at Lake Hughes. It is designed to serve special needs children with a variety of health needs. They include things like kidney disease, Crohn's and colitis, little people, diabetes, liver transplants and hemophilia just to name a few. As you can imagine their medical facilities need to be state-of-the-art as well as fun. The layout of the camp needs to meet all these special needs. It is an amazing place with a special energy and heart.

It is clear that this comes from its founder. Page Hannah Adler was a camper at Trail's End along with her brother and sister. When she was 23 she volunteered to work at Paul Newman's Hole in the Wall camp in Connecticut. She introduced many of the things that she had learned at GTE - songs, traditions, etc. She also remembered that at GTE it didn't matter what you looked like, what you wore, where you came from, how smart you were, or how good you were at the activities. It mattered that you were real and did things for the right reasons. It was a place that she felt accepted no matter what. She and her husband Lou have taken this dream to another level. They have contacts with people that also believe it could be done. It is clear that Page made this happen not to be in the spotlight but to do what is right for these children. Our hats are off to Page and her team for making good things happen for these children.


Last summer we had over 45

### "Dodging" Bear Lake Roads ... A HISTORY SNIPPET

It is not very far to Bear Lake after all, according to the old adage which says, "it's a long road which has no turning." One boy told me that it would make a fishworm dizzy to climb the Bear Lake Road. Nevertheless, there is a summer camp for boys up on the top, at the end of that road – right square in the lap of Hallett's Peak that the world is hearing about, and although some of our good parents felt our road was impassable, the Chief in his old gas buggy did over three thousand miles from camp to town and back during the summer with loads of every conceivable sort, from green campers to green vegetables, and from ice cream for boys to Omaline for horses – passengers, mail, laundry, boots that had lost their soles, swimming gangs, instructors, camp outfits, Long's Peak hikers, mammas, aunties, neighbors, harness, eggs, dads, bananas, telegrams, bows, arrows, hay, trunks, church-goers, cakes, love letters, and suits to be cleaned and pressed, made up the "freight" for the summer.

Sometimes we met ourselves coming back. Each hill had its own rattles and each curve its thrills, as you would meet a caravan of Red busses, perhaps loaded with Chipeta-ites.

Still, the old Dodge was our sure connection with the great world out beyond – rain or shine, night or day, it was always on the way. Why, my old car knows the Bear Lake Road so well that if you should start it down the hill empty it would negotiate all the switchbacks 100%,

go right to the postoffice, then the Creamery, then the Transportation office and likely get halfway home again before it could be arrested for careless driving.

Once we scared a Red Bus off the road, many times we scared deer off the road and often caught up with a snowshoe rabbit doing a four-forty down the valley. If the horn wouldn't honk, the whistle would, and the rattles gave everybody at least a chance for their lives.

So we Dodged the Bear Lake Road for the third successive season without accident of any kind, for which we are very grateful.

The contractors are at work on the new 5% road and promise it completed by October of 1927. We can then go to town on a bicycle – and hike back.


