1920s

Plus so many campfire songs have been sung to my children since they were newborns -- ‘Chipeta Call’ is one of their favorites!”

J. Kimbrough Taylor was a camper in the ‘70-‘80s who attended Ski Hi and then Trails’ End. He wrote us, “I absolutely loved my days there, especially Trails’ End. History Snippet

In camp's earliest years, Chief selected some of the finest leaders from across the country for his staff.

These were the ones who served during the 1925-26 seasons.
