Three different times during the last month, I have come across a study done by Dr. Jay Geidd regarding the teenage brain. I was first informed of Jay during a presentation by Phil Miller, a retired Air Force Chaplain.

Phil was talking to parents about building character and leadership in middle school and high school students. He mentioned that we have a short window to instill these values in young adults (usually in their early teen years). He referenced Dr. Geidd's research as he talked about the


importance of the activities that teens chose during this time of their life. Dr. Geidd says, "Those cells and connections that are used will survive and flourish. Those cells and connections that are not used will wither and die".

During the early teen years, the brain has more brain cells that it can retain so in essence, it has to "prune" the cells it doesn't use. It keeps the cells that are being used the most.

"So if a teen is doing music or sports or academics, those are the cells and connections that will be hard-wired. If they're lying on the couch or playing video games or MTV, those are the cells and connections that are going to survive," says Dr. Geidd. Thus productive activities create productive adults and




